Sankaradeva Mahavidyalaya, Pathalipahar.

College Background:

Sankaradeva Mahavidyalaya was established at Pathalipahar in the year 1982 by the efforts of local inhabitants who felt the urgency of an institute of higher education in the locality. Pathalipahar, a rural tribal sub-plan area, is located at the border of Assam and Arunachal Pradesh as a centre of integration. In spite of utter backwardness of the area and poverty of its people, this college has been striving towards an advancement and progress in all directions since its inception. This is a single faculty i.e. Arts College imparting higher education in nine subjects of Social Science and Humanities to the poor and needy students for whom higher education is a dream and beyond reach. Our college is permanently affiliated to Dibrugarh University. We have already done a lot by the assistance of UGC and other sources.

We have built a well furnished library, congenial reading room and procured a good number of books and journals. The teachers as well as the students can satisfy their thirst of knowledge using the library which is full of various types of book and current journals.

The college has two carrier oriented courses (COP) one is Applied Sociology and the other is Journalism approved and sanctioned by University Grant Commission both the two courses has found good response from the students community.

The college has an “Information and Career Guidance Cell” (ICGC) to provide information to the students about different courses, admission procedures, supply formats and advertisement of jobs in various sectors. The college has established two separate centres for specialized study, research and development of folk-art, oral-tradition, culture and preservation of age-old religious scriptures. These two centers are Sankaradeva Study and Research Centre and Tribal Development Centre.

The college has a band of young, energetic and enthusiastic teachers who are actively participative in both academic and community oriented activities. That is why we have already organized National Seminar/Workshop and number of National environmental awareness campaigns, AIDS awareness campaigns, Medical camps etc. college is a member of Sydney based International NGO “Clean-up the World”. The college had applied voluntarily to NAAC for Assessment and Accreditation. The NAAC Peer team visited the college and made through supervision on the basis of SSR prepared by the college. After being satisfied, the NAAC awarded “B” Grade to us, which is another milestone in the history of this rural college with limited resource.

1. Construction of departmental building.

A two storied building measuring 80X40 Sq ft for the department of Economics, Political Science and English has been completed so far. Electrification and water supply has been installed, with two wash room. Each department have one faculty room and two class rooms. In the Department of Economics one digital board is installed for easy and prompt teaching & learning.

2. Completion of the construction of approach road to college sports complex.

The construction of all weather approach road to the college sports complex could not be completed due to paucity of fund .Moreover the preliminary works for the construction of the approach road has been washed away due to heavy rain falls, as the area is heavily rain faded, which is proved by the research scholar from "Yako Hama University" Japan, under the collaboration with Guwahati University. The Yako Hama University has installed one digital rain gauge in our college for measuring intensity of rain fall in this area.

3. *Development of the College sports complex.*

The construction of Indoor sports complex measuring 95ft x 45ft is completed. The floor is made up of Wood, having 150 seating capacity, with proper electrification. The indoor complex consists one volleyball court, one badminton court and one table tennis board.

4. *Procurement of more books for college library :-*

The college authority has purchased about 516 numbers of different text & reference books for the students' and teachers in this session.

5. *Organizing District Level Badminton and Volley ball Competition:*

An inter district volley ball competition was held on 11th Feb'2016. A total number of eight teams participated the competition. Our college Volley ball team has also participated in the event.

6. *Organizing District Level Shooting Competition:*

District level shooting competition was organized by "Sankaradeva Mahavidyalaya Shooting Range" affiliated to "Assam Rifle and Shooting Association", Guwahati, on 4th to 5th Aug 2015. From our Range Eight (8) Shooters were qualified for State Level Shooting Competition in Guwahati. In the State Level Shooting Competition which was held on 27th Aug to 17th Sept 2015, one participant in 10 mtrs pistol shooting has obtained Silver medal and in 10 mtrs Rifle shooting two participants from our Shooting Range were awarded with Gold and Silver medal.

7. *Toilet facilities for Boys & Girls under "Swacha Bharat Abhijan"*

Separate Wash room facilities have been constructed for both boys & girls under the scheme of "**Swacha Bharat Abhijan**". The construction work was done under 'CSR' initiative by "Engineer India Limited". The plan and estimate was prepared by "Engineer India Limited", measuring 8^{ft} x 10^{ft} Sq. ft., having running water facilities for both the wash room. Moreover the floor and the wall is fitted with Tiles.

Part B:

3. The college authority has accepted total six numbers of well defined goals for the all round development of the college together with the local people of the catchments area.
- In the beginning of the session, as the University of Dibrugarh introduced the Semester Course in the colleges, so to make the students aware of the course and to make efficient the principal takes personal initiative to counseling the student in their respective classes.
 - To bring the importance of social harmony, integration and enhancement in overall socio-cultural aspects of the students, the college arranged cultural workshops on classical (Satriya) songs and dance in association with Sankaradeva Study and Research Centre. The workshop is opened for college students and youth of the local area.
 - To create the awareness among the students about the glorious past of human history and wealth, the college arranged to teach the student community in association with the department of history and Natya Charcha(Drama Section) by organizing group discussion and workshops.
 - To create awareness about the environmental degradation and digester management, the college adopted the scheme of Plantation and also teaches the students through the Environmental Studies Course, which is a compulsory subject in degree classes.
 - Organization of counseling programme with the District and Local administrative officer, where the local people and ex-students' are also entangled.
 - Socio-economic survey of local backward villages to know their socio-economic aspects, under "Think and Work Together" Scheme.

4. New academic programme initiated (UG and PG):

The college has received permission to open a Study Centre of Krishna Kanta handique State Open University and continued the both PG and Degree courses till today. The post Graduate Courses in Sociology and Political Science started in last year. Moreover, examination centre for National Institute of Open School (NIS) has been introduced as per request from MHRD, New Delhi. The examination is held biannually (i.e. on May-June and Oct.-Nov).

5. Inter-disciplinary programme:

The college has launched Inter-disciplinary programme in collaboration with Sankaradeva Study and Research Centre and Tribal Development Centre respectively. Through Sankaradeva Study and Research Centre, students are involved to learn classical songs, dance and drama and to learn the old manuscripts (Sauchipat).

Through the Tribal development centre (TDC). Socio-economy survey programme is conducted in time to time. Moreover inter-disciplinary classes are organized in between various related departments, whenever the authority feels it necessary.

From the beginning of the semester courses, the Semester examinations are held as per the programme of Dibrugarh University. The Semester Monitoring Committee of the college arrange sessional Examinations time to time and Major Test Examinations are conducted under the departmental supervision to select the efficient students for the major subjects.

19. Community Services:

a) Training programme on Dhulia Oza:

The College organized two weeks workshop on Dhulia Oza from 20th August to 2nd September'2015 to train 71 participants from different localities. The workshop was sponsored by Sangeet Natak Academy, New Delhi. The workshop was presided by Dr. M. Bora, Principal, Sankaradeva Mahavidyalaya and inaugurated by Mr. Bhaba. Kt. Dutta, coordinator, IQAC, Sankaradeva Mahavidyalaya, All total 11 (eleven) nos. of Dhulia Oza (Guru) were present to taught the participants and two Ozas were entrusted as resource person for two technical session each day. The participants were divided into two groups, i.e (a) Beginners & (b) Learners. The Beginners were taught the fundamental & basic knowledge of "Dhol" and the Learners were taught the "Dhulia Oza Hat". All the participants were provided with refreshment and the Ozas were given T.A & D.A as per norms.

b) Counseling:-

As the University of Dibrugarh introduced the Semester Course in the colleges, so in the beginning of the session, as per directives of the Dibrugarh University, the principal takes personal initiative to counseling the student in their respective classes, to make them aware of the course and to make efficient.

C) NSS (National Social Service Scheme) Camp:-

The College has an NSS wing with more than 100 numbers of students and it is recognized by Dibrugarh University. In this session the NSS wings of the college, under the guidance of NSS programme officer Mr. Brojen Saikia undertook a cleanup camp from 19th march to 21st march 2016 at Dikrongparia Janajati ME School. All total 75 students participated in the clean up camp, out of 75 students, 50 were boys & 25 were girls students. In those three days camp, the volunteers cleaned the school camps and they constructed a new link road to school. More over they conducted an awareness programme on water born diseases, which was chaired by principal & Pryinka Bora as resource person for water born and infectious diseases. On the last day a cultural show was performed by the volunteers in front of the villagers and school students.

19. Teachers and Officers newly recruited:

The college has recruited 02 nos. of Assistant professor on permanent basis against expired & promotional vacancy in the department of Economics & Political Science respectively. The appointment was purely based on UGC guideline.

23. Course in which students assessment of teachers is introduced and the action taken on students feedback:

Students are entrusted the task of evaluation through college XYZ formats of their teachers and existing course. It is said that students are the best judge of their teachers. After final feedback report, the Principal personally talked with the few teachers who get low grade and requests them to rectify their drawbacks.

Students Assessment of course contents is seriously taken. A few rectifications pointed out by the students is sent to Dibrugarh University by the Principal.

The experience of outgoing students is quite important. So, feedback of outgoing students is always regarded as valuable for college. Teachers, course content and overall academic environment are the subject matters to be commented by the outgoing students. Those evaluations are taken seriously by the authority and undertake adequate steps for overall upliftment.

24. Unit cost of education:

25. Computerization of administration and the process of admission and examinations, results, issue of certificates:

Administration and the process of admission, examinations, results, issue of certificates have been computerized.

The entire process of examinations has been conducted by Dibrugarh University. Only sessional and test examination are conducted by the college itself.

26. Increase in infrastructural facilities:

- i. A two storied building was constructed and the ground floor has been entrusted to the department of Economics. The ground floor consists of three rooms measuring 20x20 sq ft each, one room is meant for faculty members having wash room facilities and other two rooms for the classes, equipped with digital board.
- ii. Construction of one cycle stand shed measuring 56x12 sq. ft. is completed so far to accommodate at-least 75 numbers of two wheelers.
- iii. Out door stadium, with eight lane and three numbers of galleries, is under construction with the aid received from UGC
- iv. The Boundary walls of the out door sport complex is under construction and three side of the boundary wall is completed so far, measuring 420ft. x 380ft.

27. Technology up gradation:

Students are being trained in the computer centre for internet, which is compulsory for the students of the computer centre of the college. Teachers are generally using the internet facilities for the preparation of their classes. More over the college completed a Computer cum Language Laboratory and the most of the students are benefited with this computer laboratory.

29. Financial aid to students:

The Union body members were extempted from student fees. The government of Assam (Dept. of WPT & BC) offers scholarship for ST, SC & OBC students.

30. Activities and support from the Alumni Association:

There is a congenial environment in between the association and the authority, therefore the association is always ready to help as and when necessary. The association enthusiastically takes part in Seminar, workshop, awareness programme and socio-cultural activities. Moreover 2 (two) nos. of journal for each department have been subscribed by the Alumni Association of the College.

31. Activities and support from the Parent-Teacher Association:

The parent-teacher association generally sits two times in a year i.e. in the beginning of the semester classes and the principal of the college analyzed the last results and keep open for discussion. The parents take part in the discussion the difficulties generally faced by the students in their courses and examinations. The PTA of the college is very co-operative and put forward the positive suggestions for the all round development of the college.

32. Health services:

The first-Aid centre of the college tendered the first-aid treatment in time and serious cases are sent to the nearest health centre as and when felt necessary.

33. Performance in sports activities:

In every session the Students Union Body of the college organizes College Week according to the academic Calendar of Dibrugarh University. Apart from the sports and cultural activities of the college, a group of selected students participated in the Youth Festival organized by Dibrugarh University. Our college Volley ball team has also participated inter district volley ball competition held at Pthalipahar. Even the Sankaradeva college shooting range has organized district level shooting competition in the month of August. From our Range Eight (8) Shooters have for State Level Shooting Competition in Guwahati. The State Level Shooting Competition which was held on 27th Aug to 17th Sept 2015, Mr. Rakesh Neog participated in 10 mtrs. pistol shooting and obtained Silver medal, In 10 mtrs Rifle shooting Mr. Nilut Prasad Boruah and Mr. Babul Hazarika were awarded Gold and Silver medal respectively.

34. Incentives to outstanding sports persons:

The students qualifying in the district level competitions awarded with lump-sum money (cost for to and fro and lodging) for participating in the state and national level competitions'. Moreover, the participants' in the youth festival and other sports competition are provided free scholarship.
